Designing Courses based on Collaborative Learning with ICT Platforms Course designs can have positive impact on students' English learning mainly because students in an EFL environment have a limited access to the target language outside of the classroom. This presentation consists of three parts. Part one will discuss the presenter's experience with F-LECCS. Part two will focus on the presenter's personal theory and practice as educator, based upon "Collaborative Learning." Finally, part three, will cover examples from the ICT platforms such as Moodle, as used in the speaker's regular lectures.

About the presenter: Toshifumi Sawazaki earned an MBA at Rutgers Business School in 2000. He has been teaching at Jin-ai University since 2009 and at Jin-ai Women's College since 2010.
